Getting around in Blanes

Bike: 4 km of flat coastline. The parking points for bikes make this an easy and convenient form of transport for getting around the city.

Public transport: urban bus, the *trenet* (tourist train), the botanic bus and the Garden Open Tour bus connect the district of Els Pins to the city centre, port and gardens.

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Recommendations for responsible tourism:

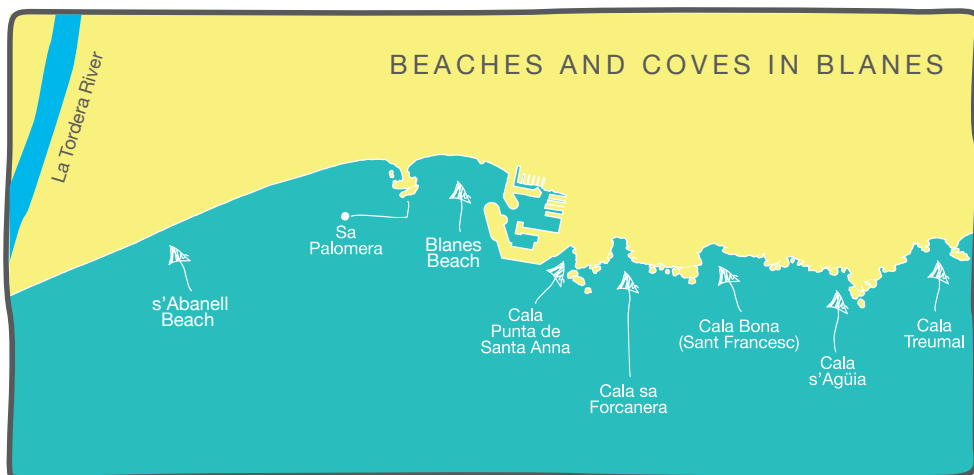
- Use water responsibly
- Get around by bike or on foot
- Consume and buy local products
- Respect the peace and quiet of other residents
- Keep the streets clean
- Look after the environment
- Be responsible with the rubbish you generate

Remember:

- Park your vehicle correctly and don't leave any valuables inside
- Avoid pickpockets and thieves; never let your bag or wallet/purse out of your sight
- Stay out of the hot sun in the middle of the day
- Protect yourself from the sun with a hat, sunscreen and sunglasses
- Drink water frequently to avoid dehydration
- Pay attention to the safety flags on the beach: **red flag - bathing prohibited;**
yellow flag - bathe with caution; green flag - bathing permitted
- Request an identity bracelet for small children at the Tourist Office

02. Romantic and floral town

Blanes invites you to relax and to discover peaceful and elegant sites.



The vegetation and orography of Blanes constitute a unique natural heritage of great scenic and environmental value.

- Canary Island date palms, Washingtonia palms from Mexico, Mediterranean dwarf palms (wild palm tree native to Catalonia)
- Sentry plants
- Aleppo pines and stone pines



La Tordera River

Natural area with protection status due to its fauna and flora. When it comes to vegetation, the area stands out for its elm, poplar and ash forests, along with its reed beds.

La Tordera is also a strategic point on the migration route of birds and is used as an observatory. For birdwatchers there are grey herons, little egrets, kingfishers and common sandpipers. It's also home to other animals such as the Mediterranean tree frog, the Spanish pond turtle or the water snake.



Marimurtra Botanical Garden

The Marimurtra Botanical Garden is one of the scenic gems of the area. Set among cliffs surrounding the sea, it's home to over 3,000 plant species. Housed in a Mediterranean forest covering ten hectares, this four-hectare garden is split into three zones – subtropical, temperate and Mediterranean. The Marimurtra Botanical Garden, declared a Cultural Site of National Interest by the Government of Catalonia, was founded almost 100 years ago by the German businessman Carl Faust, a patron of biological sciences, with the goal of founding an international scientific research centre in Blanes.

Pinya de Rosa

This tropical garden houses one of the most interesting cacti collections in Europe, with more than 7,000 species from all over the world. The garden was founded by the renowned Catalan engineer Ferran Rivièrre de Caralt, who began its creation not long after purchasing the estate in 1945.

03. More than 1000 years of history

History is still alive in the centre of Blanes. The Viscounts of Cabrera left their mark on the city in the form of several monuments. It was a period of privileges and wars, in which control of the sea was synonymous with influence and wealth. A journey back through the history of Blanes reveals illustrious forbears who contributed to shaping the New World.

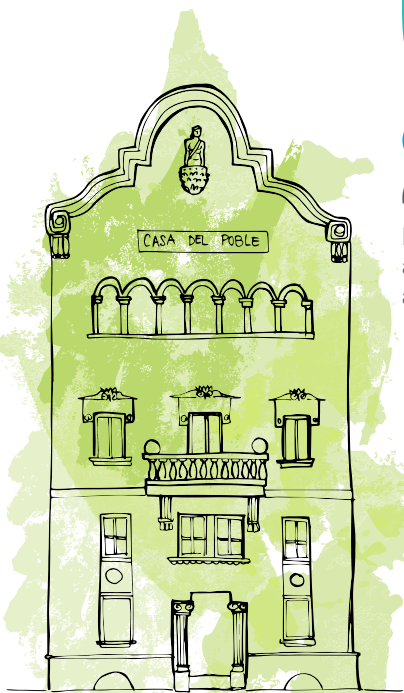
The *indianos* or *americanos* were townsfolk who headed to the Americas in the 19th century to seek their fortune and who returned home wealthy some years later. We can trace their legacy in Blanes today through the surviving houses they built for themselves.

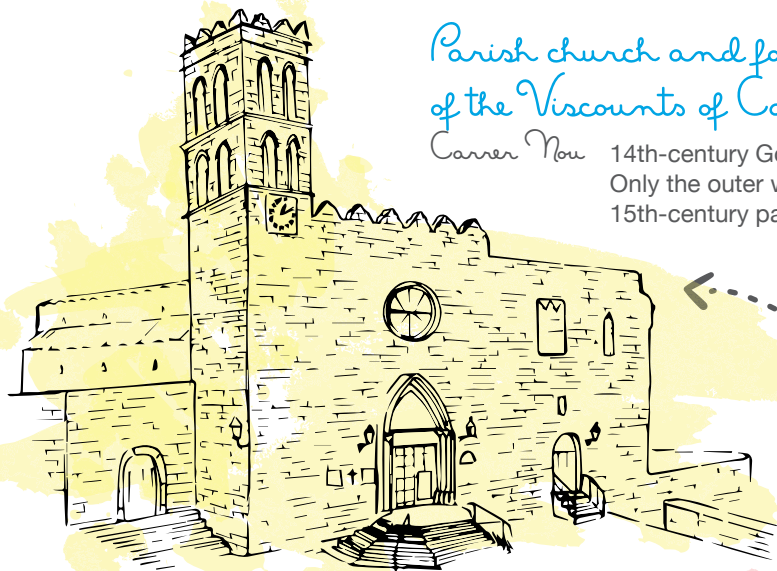
Carrer Esperança

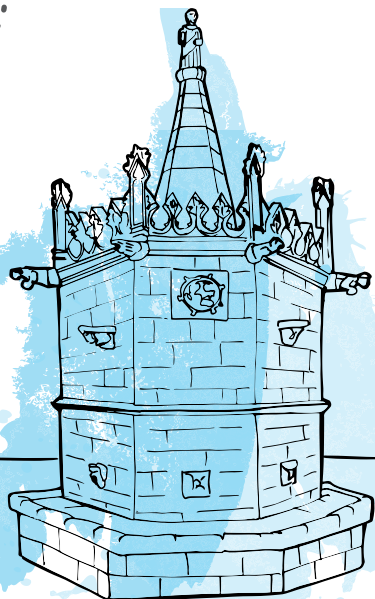

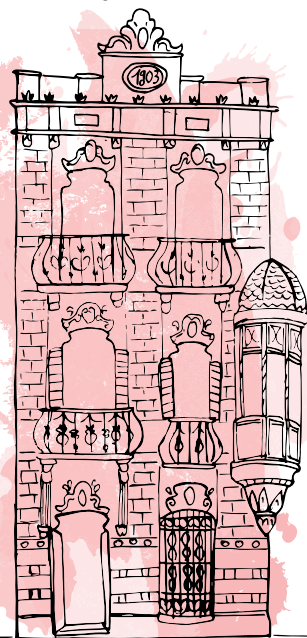

04. Inspiration of artists

Ruyra, Alemany, Puig i Llensa, Sagarra, Maragall or Bolaño, surnames of poets and writers who found inspiration in Blanes and whose influence on the town is reflected in literary trails and heritage elements.

Several musicians and painters have also settled and worked in Blanes over the centuries, such a **Roig Soler, Planells, Bedós, Bataller or Padern**.

05. City dedicated to tourism, retail and services

06. City of fireworks and festivals

Blanes is a cheerful Mediterranean city with a packed calendar of festivals and events all year round.

Excitement builds in the city at the end of July when the Costa Brava International Fireworks Competition is held. The origins of fireworks in Blanes date back more than 100 years.

This major event takes place during the *Festa Major* of Santa Anna (the city's main festival), when the bright lights and smoke intermingle with concerts, fairs and traditional events. It's time to enjoy the festivities and the good weather.



Blanes still celebrates traditional festivals that date back to ancient times. You can watch the diables parading with their fireworks or dance with the *gegants*, *gegantons* and *capgrossos*.

There's non-stop activity! Blanes is a dynamic and lively city thanks to its traditional and neighbourhood festivals, along with its packed calendar of of cultural, culinary, musical and sporting events. Are you up for it?

07. Products of the sea and land

Mediterranean and maritime town

The life and history of Blanes has been shaped by the sea. Today, the port combines its commercial fishing activity with maritime leisure pursuits and a mooring service (over 300 moorings) and provides all the services necessary for sailing enthusiasts.



Fish auctions

There are two daily fish auctions which visitors can watch from the tiered seating for a token fee: one in the morning with the catch of the seine boats (mainly sardines, mackerel and jack mackerel) and one in the afternoon with the catch of the trawler, beach seine and small gear fleets (prawns, monkfish, sand eels, etc.).



The local gastronomy is closely related to the town's fishing tradition. Some dishes have been honed to perfection over the years by our fishermen, chefs and home cooks. One of the most typical fishermen's dishes of Blanes is *suquet de peix*, a fish dish prepared in different ways depending on the chef and the catch of the day



Blanes devotes much of its culinary calendar to local products, with some months featuring one product in particular: oily fish in April, the Blanes prawn in May and the *suquet de peix* fish dish in October. The restaurants that form part of the event offer a special menu featuring the star product. All the food included in this campaign comes from Blanes fish market.



A wide variety of local products are available in Blanes with the emphasis on quality. Some of the most famous products in Blanes are the result of business initiatives and long family traditions.

The Club de Vela Blanes (Blanes Yacht Club), founded more than 70 years ago, is a modern, state-of-the-art facility that combines a great location, a wonderful climate and a comprehensive range of services for nautical tourism enthusiasts: sailing courses, kayaking, stand-up paddle boarding, windsurfing, boat hire, mooring service... The club has parking facilities for 180 vehicles and organises top events (international and European events, Spanish and Catalan championship), making it a superb tourist attraction.



09. Sports City, a unique venue

Strategically located and with a surface area of 40,000 m², Blanes Sports City is a unique facility on the Costa Brava, boasting versatile spaces suitable for all sorts of events, ranging from sports and music events to social and business functions, not to mention fairs and exhibitions... with parking facilities for 360 vehicles. The Sports City offers endless options and first-class services. The courts have been designed to cater for different sports in the same space at the same time.

Montseny Natural Park

Montseny Natural Park, declared a Biosphere Reserve, is a great place to enjoy nature and amazing forest landscapes.



Architectural complex of Hostalric

Hostalric, a Site of National Interest, boasts an abundance of mediaeval heritage. What's more, you can discover Catalonia's culinary heritage at the Domus Sent Soví centre.



Montsoriu Castle

This is the most important Catalan Gothic castle from a historical, architectural and archaeological perspective.



Caldes de Malavella spa town

Selva is the land of thermal waters and Caldes de Malavella is its spa town par excellence, with spas, Roman baths, hot springs, etc.



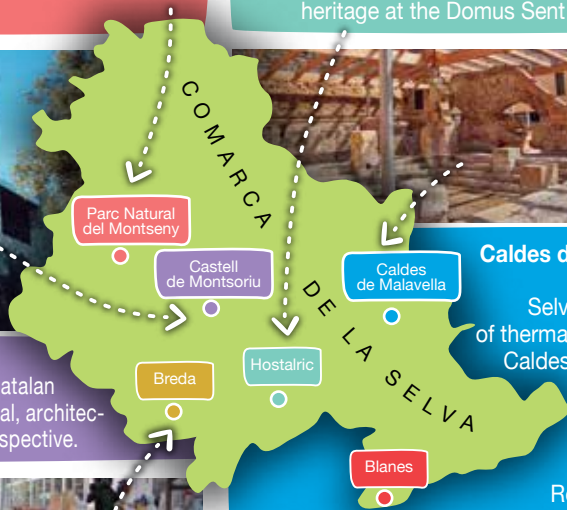
Breda, town of ceramics
